Dear Friends,

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit in March of 2020, we immediately shifted our focus in an effort to help protect our first-responders from the deadly virus. In the early days of the pandemic, DPD and DFD were hit hard by the virus, with both departments losing active members and hundreds more sick and quarantined. Our donors and community stepped up more than ever before to help protect them from this unprecedented threat to their safety and the safety of their families.

I believe the work that we did securing surgical masks, N95s, thermometers, hand sanitizer, cleaning supplies, medicine and food for quarantined/sick first-responders truly saved lives. I am proud to say that the Detroit Public Safety Foundation secured more than \$309,000 in monetary donations and \$554,000 in in-kind donations for COVID relief.

Despite the pandemic, we were still able to hold our two annual events honoring Detroit's first-responders. Women in Blue was postponed until the end of July and was held in a small, socially distanced, outdoor ceremony. The Above & Beyond Ceremony in November was completely virtual but we were able to have a beautiful tribute for our first-responders that was available for anyone to view.

In 2020, we received our first federal grant from the Department of Justice for \$743,761 for a Stop School Violence initiative which is being implemented through the Detroit Youth Violence Prevention Initiative.

Despite smaller fundraising events, a shift in focus to COVID supplies for much of the year and adjusting to working from home during state mandated orders, our small team accomplished a lot in 2020. We finished the year in a strong and stable financial position. We are grateful for the countless donors who helped us continue our mission and showed their support for Detroit's brave first-responders. We cannot thank you enough.




### Income by Category Year Ended December 31, 2020
